Carpenter Chair and Associate Professor of Ethics and Society at Vanderbilt University Divinity School and author of seven books and numerous articles. She has served as the Executive Director of the Black Religious Scholars Group, Inc., the Society of Christian Ethics, and past president of the Society of Race, Ethnicity and Religion. She is a leading Christian social ethicist, womanist scholar, and award winning theological educator.

Her research and teaching interests lie at the intersection of ethics, feminist/womanist studies, Black Church studies, critical pedagogy, critical race theory and liberation theology, and how these fields engage broad questions of intersectionality, cultural memory, ethical responsibility and social justice.
