Stacey Floyd-Thomas will explore the ethical task of the Black female liberation theologian to reconstruct and redeem from invisibility the challenges and resources of African American women in light of the history of the centuries-long struggle to unload the sacred creeds, social ills, toxic right-wing politics fueled by Eurocentric racism and male chauvinism. Her lecture will introduce womanist theological ethics as it uncovers the burdens and blights of biblical antiquity and contemporary society by offering the critical resources and razor-sharp alternative ways of thinking, believing, and living that illuminates African American women's painful and persistent struggle to hold their racial, gender and religious identities intact.
