Gemma Tulud Cruz, a Filipino-Australian theologian, was senior lecturer in Theology at Australian Catholic University (ACU) prior to her early retirement in 2022. She currently engages in strategic research in her capacity as a fellow at ACU and Saint Vincent's School of Theology in the Philippines. She is a leading scholar in the field of migration theologies.

The age of migration has dramatically transformed the lives of individuals and families, as well as communities, nation-states, and the world as a global village. Climate change-induced migration and the two contrasting views of migrants and migration, including in climate change and environmental discourse, has added a layer of complexity to an already volatile phenomenon. The lecture will explore the age of migration as a double-edged sword, with attention to its theological challenges and how ethical and practical or pastoral responses might look like amid the increasing contestation and weaponization of migration, particularly the migration of vulnerable populations, in transit and receiving countries.
